



## Titanic Hotel Liverpool

Hospitality case study



Stanley Docks in Liverpool is located within a world heritage site, the 1840's buildings are listed structures and have been vacant for many years. Darmody Architecture have developed a master strategy through the exploitation of the Victorian structures across the entire site. The programme includes two hotels, a short stay accommodation facility, large scale commercial, retail and gallery accommodation.

The Titanic Liverpool Hotel is the first phase to be completed, the contemporary hotel is carefully grafted into the Jesse Hartley (19th Century Architecture) structure to achieve a Manhattan loft experience.
